

A few of the most popular LAW (non-criminal or social) placements available through The Philadelphia Center:

Elam Revis, Legal Intern: Elam Reavis, LLP is an entertainment law firm run by partners James Elam and Donyale Reavis. James Elam established himself as a mover and shaker when he began practicing entertainment law in 1997. The practice focuses on corporate and intellectual property issues primarily for entertainment related entities ranging from recording artists, songwriters, artist managers, record labels, production companies, publishing companies and comedians among others. Elam Reavis lists Philly International Records, Grammy-winning songwriter Jill Scott, King Tee, Jaguar, Ram Squad, Major Figgas, DJ Cash Money and DJ Miz, Mekka Star and Men at Large as current or former clients. Legal Intern responsibilities include a large volume of administrative assistance and opportunities to learn contract law and experience the structural aspects of the music industry.

Gloria Gilman; Legal Assistant: Gloria Gilman is Philadelphia attorney with a private legal practice focusing on family and employment law as well as civil rights. Student Intern will work as a legal assistant for this accomplished attorney. In addition, this position may afford undergraduates the opportunity to work with the National Lawyer's Guild and/or Institutional Legal Services, a non-profit law firm that represents institutionalized persons.

Lisa Baird, Legal Assistant: Lisa Baird has been an immigration lawyer for ten years. Ideally, candidates for the Legal Assistant position would speak Spanish or another foreign language, but that is by no means a prerequisite. Work could include the following: answering the phone and taking messages; doing initial interviews with prospective clients; researching country conditions for people seeking political asylum; sending mailings; and filling out immigration forms. This opportunity would be especially interesting for someone who enjoys meeting people from different backgrounds, cultures, etc.

Nicholas A. Clemente, PC; Legal Intern: Clemente PC is a small general litigation law firm, specializing in all types of civil and criminal trial law. The firm's attorneys have experience in family law, bankruptcy, workers compensation, real estate, sports and entertainment law, products liability, estate planning and probate, and criminal defense. This internship is an excellent opportunity for a student to gain exposure to many types of law in a friendly and supportive environment. Legal Intern will be responsible for helping to prepare cases, attending court, and conducting legal research.

Pennsylvania Law Weekly; Reporter: American Lawyer Media of Philadelphia publishes the Pennsylvania Law Weekly (a statewide legal newspaper) and The Legal Intelligencer (a daily legal newspaper in Philadelphia). The

Pennsylvania Law Weekly is the only publication in the state that provides lawyers with timely analysis of state and federal cases. It is a must-have resource for exclusive statewide reporting that can "make or break" cases. Each issue includes: eight to ten analytical articles that let you know about the most important cases filed and how they impact law practices; up to 40 case digests, including: every state appellate decision and key common pleas and federal court decisions-reported within weeks of being filed; Verdicts & Settlements columns that feature 2-3 summaries of recent verdicts, including defense verdicts, and settlements. Student Reporter will write news articles using court opinions and personal interviews as sources. Conduct interviews with judges and attorneys, analyze case law, and write about legal issues. Work with editing and desktop publishing.

Spivack and Spivack: Spivack & Spivack, LLP is a dynamic, two-generational law firm with two partners and an associate. The firm primarily represents Plaintiffs in civil personal injury matters, including medical malpractice and other personal injury matters. Partner Ken Spivack is extremely busy with court appearances, depositions, and client meetings -- all of which the intern would have the opportunity to assist with. Interns would assist Mr. Spivack in the work-up of an entire case from intake to resolution (client meetings, attending depositions, court filings, resolution of third party suits, and the collection and distribution of fees). Additionally, a significant portion of Mr. Spivack's time is spent managing the firm and generating new business. A student would have the opportunity to learn how to run his or her own small business with exposure to the banking, accounting, and marketing that is involved in running a successful business.

Zane Management, Inc.; Legal Intern: Since 1978, athletes and entertainers have been choosing Zane Management, Inc. for quality, professional representation. Founded by Lloyd Zane Remick, Esq., Zane Management, Inc. specializes in marketing and managing notable performers and personalities in entertainment, sports, media and the arts. This full-service company provides career planning, including appearances and endorsements, movie and television product placement, video and merchandising production, extensive legal services and other consultation as needed at the individual and corporate level. Mr. Remick is a major player in the field and was named Wharton School's "man of the year" for 2003, besting Donald Trump. Legal Intern's responsibilities include preparing contracts, logging demo tapes, copyright research, trademark research, attending meetings and negotiations, and some office management.
